JUNE 19, 2012**

**7:00 P.M. TWP. COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING**

Mayor Glembocki opened the meeting in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act requirements.

Mayor Glembocki asked for a moment of silence for our troops and any personal reasons.

Mayor Glembocki requested that the Clerk carry the roll call over from the Board of Health meeting (Mayor Glembocki presiding with Committeemembers: DiCicco, Murphy, Germanio and Teefy present).

Motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Teefy, with 5 ayes and no nays, that the following Officer's Report were approved:

The Committee discussed an amendment to the Fees Ordinance (Chapter 98) to establish an Article V which would pertain to the fees to be charged for Vital Statistic documents. Mayor Glembocki indicated that they were looking to increase the fees to bring us in line with the other municipalities. The Committee agreed to increase the fees from \$3.00 for certified copies to \$10.00 and to establish a fee for certification copies of \$10.00. Mayor Glembocki requested that the Solicitor draft the ordinance and to incorporate language alluding to the statutes so that if the state changes their fees we will not have to amend our ordinance.

The Committee discussed the Pension and Benefits Employer Database Update Form. The Municipal Clerk explained that the previous Deputy Mayor is listed as the Supervisor of the Certifying Officer, which is the Chief Financial Officer. The Clerk indicated that the Committee needed to decide if they want to continue to have a Supervisor of the Certifying Officer and if so complete the form naming the new one.

Motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Germanio, that the Deputy Mayor, Brian Teefy, be named the Supervisor of the Certifying Officer for the Pension and Benefits Employer Database. The motion carried.

Motion was made by Germanio, seconded by Teefy, that the meeting be open for public comment.

Tom Laughlin, the Township's webmaster and owner of Power of Production Studio, indicated that on 06/17/2012 the Township launched its new website. Mr. Laughlin indicated that he donated this work to the Township which is a cost savings of approximately \$3,500.00. Mr. Laughlin thanked the Committee for moving the website into the future.

The Committee thanked Mr. Laughlin and Mayor Glembocki urged everyone to visit the new website. He indicated that there is a lot of information and easy to navigate and has a new calendar of events.

Jack Connolly, 651 Petersburg Road and President of the Dennisville Historic Home Owners Association (DHHOA), thanked the Committee for partnering with Tom Laughlin of Power of Production Studio. He indicated that the new website is tremendous and thanked the Committee for including the DHHOA on the website. Mr. Connolly stated that the DHHOA works hard for the Township and will continue to do so.

Walt Noll, 164 Gravel Hole Road, commented on the new website and indicated that it looks good, more modern and that the Natural Resources Committee has been added. Mr. Noll indicated that he wanted to address some ATV issues that were discussed at the last meeting. Mr. Noll questioned the status of the ATV Sub-Committee and if they were going to continue to meeting to address the ATV issues that do not pertain to the Planning Board and that we will look at the ATV issue on two fronts.

Mr. Donohue commented on the Buena Vista ordinance and indicated that it had been distributed to the Township Committee. He stated that Mayor Glembocki and Committeeman Germanio and himself were scheduling a meeting to review it and hopefully they would have a recommendation by the next meeting. Mr. Donohue indicated that we have held off referring the issue to the Planning Board until this portion is accomplish, which would limit the scope for the Planning Board.

Mr. Noll questioned the status of the ATV Sub-Committee and Deputy Mayor Teefy indicated that it is on hold while the Committee reviews the Buena Vista ordinance and how we move forward with referring it to the Planning Board.

Mr. Noll and Mayor Glembocki discussed the Buena Vista ordinance.

Mr. Noll commented on the letter that is to be forwarded to the Planning Board regarding the ATV matter.

Mr. Donohue reiterated that they will send the letter after they determine the scope of the ordinance to address the public property issues.

Mr. Noll commented on Mr. Gary Gibson's 3/7/2011 letter to Anthony Harvatt, regarding the if motor-cross park is an allowable use in the B (Business) zone in Dennis Township as well as Committeeman Germanio's follow up request. Mr. Noll questioned where those request lie now that there is a combined board.

Committeeman Germanio indicated that he has spoken to Mr. Stevens who is the Chairman of the combined board and he indicated that only a person with vested interest in the property can request a determination.

Mr. Noll requested that Committeeman Germanio get the statutes that pertain to this and questioned the public's ability to question what an allowable use in a particular zone. Mr. Noll clarified that they were asking what was allowed in a particular zone not one particular property.

Committeeman Germanio indicated that he would talk with Mr. Stevens again to clarify that it is what is allowed in a zone not an interpretation of what is allowed on a particular property.

Mr. Noll and Committeeman Germanio continued to discuss this issue and Committeeman Germanio indicated that he believed they were waiting to replay until the consolidation of the boards was completed.

Mr. Donohue indicated that he could look into this matter for the Township Committee and render an opinion. Mr. Donohue commented on the practice of Board/Committee attorneys answering questions from the public and on the interpretation process.

Mr. Noll commented on past response from the former Deputy Mayor and on professionals inquiring prior to submitting an application.

Mr. Donohue commented and indicated that the Committee could incorporate that into the referral to the Planning Board.

Mr. Noll commented on the last time he and Mr. Gibson were before the Planning Board regarding the ATV issue in 2010. He indicated that they had conflict of interest issues regarding the Planning Board Solicitor.

Mr. Donohue indicated that conflict of interest regarding the Planning Board Solicitor is not an issue for the Township Committee, that it must first go before the Planning Board and then to Trenton.

Mr. Noll continued regarding the proposed conflict as it pertains to section 185-72 of the Code and Mr. Donohue reiterated that the response would come from the Board and Board Attorney and in the absence of satisfaction it would have to go to Trenton.

Mr. Noll commented on another conflict of interest concern that was shared in a letter to Mr. Stevens and then Mayor Murphy dated 10/24/2009 regarding a previous member of the Board and that they never got a response. Mr. Noll commented on videos of alleged illegal riding on U-Tube and questioned possible responsibility if an accident occurs and the Township has done nothing.

Mr. Donohue questioned Mr. Noll if you can identify the alleged violators in the video and he indicated you could not but the property is.

Mr. Noll, members of the Township Committee, Mayor Glembocki and Mr. Donohue commented on enforcement by the State Police and the Township and regulations within Title 39 and what is the right-of-way.

Mr. Donohue indicated that he believes you will never get 100% satisfaction on this issue and that the Township Committee is trying to address the issue in the most practical. Mr. Donohue commented further on enforcement issues.

Mr. Noll indicated that he was looking for clarification on the right-of-way issue.

Mr. Donohue commented on right-of-ways and instances where options can vary.

The discussion of varying forms of enforcement continued including the U.S. Fish and Wildlife property along Route 83 and the issue of pursuit.

Mr. Gary Gibson, 158 Gravel Hole Road read his 05/07/2011 letter to Zoning Board of Adjustment Solicitor, Anthony Harvatt, regarding whether a motor cross track would be an allowable use in the B Business zone in Dennis Township. Mr. Gibson commented on correspondences and discussions regarding obtaining an answer to this question.

Mr. Gibson commented on the conflict issues that Mr. Noll had commented on regarding the Planning Board Solicitor and his brother-in-law and a member of the Planning Board who is an ATV enthusiast. Mr. Gibson questioned Mr. Donohue if this issue was going to Trenton.

Mr. Donohue indicated no and clarified what he had previously stated and reiterated the process for a conflict of interest concern.

Mr. Gibson commented further regarding the ATV issue and read the 09/13/2011 letter from Mr. Harvatt into the record. Mr. Gibson commented on the Buena Vista ordinance and other ordinances they submitted regarding ATVs or noise, as well as Mr. Noll and his ordinance that they drafted. Mr. Gibson stated that they were still waiting for an answer regarding the status of the ATV Sub-Committee.

The Committee indicated that the question has been answered, it is currently on hold.

The Committee and Mr. Donohue commented on the efforts to move this issue forward.

Mr. Keith Larsen, 333 45<sup>th</sup> Place, Sea Isle City commented on the past and current zoning of his business, Larsen's Marina. Mr. Larsen questioned if his Marina will be affected by the ongoing Master Plan revisions.

Mr. Jack Gibson indicated that he did not believe so, but that he would look into the issue and let him know.

Deputy Mayor Teefy commented on discussions with Mr. Stevens, Planning Board Chairman, regarding the zoning change from Marina to Conservation.

Mr. Larsen and Committeeman DiCicco commented on his previous discussions on getting the zone changed back to Marina and the Planning Board's Chairman recommendation of the need for a sub-division to delineate the Marina zone from the Conservation zone of the 90+ acre lot.

The Engineer commented on ascertaining a reasonable dimension of what is actually Marina.

Mr. Larsen asked the status of the Master Plan and the Mayor indicated that they hope to have it completed by the end of the year.

Deputy Mayor Teefy and Mr. Donohue advised Mr. Larsen to meet with the Engineer to provide him with the necessary information.

Mr. Larsen and the Committee continued to discuss the Marina zone issue.

Committeeman Germanio requested that Mr. Larsen return in July to give the Committee an update.

Mr. Larsen commented on concerns he has Capt. Robbins new tenant blocking the right-of-way of Old Sea Isle Blvd. Mayor Glembocki, Deputy Mayor Teefy and Mr. Donohue indicated that they would review the site.

Jack Connolly, 651 Petersburg Road, indicated that he had his camera here this evening and offered to take a picture of the Committee with Mr. Laughlin commemorating his donation of the updated website.

Motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Murphy, that the public comment portion be closed. All in favor and the motion carried.

Motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Teefy, to release the March 20, 2012 Executive Session Minutes with the discussions regarding the cell tower lease redacted due to the discussions being ongoing. All in favor, motion carried.

Let the record reflect that the following Resolution Nos. 2012-93 thru 2012-96 were part of a consent agenda with a block roll call vote.

Motion was made by Teefy, seconded by DiCicco, with 5 ayes and no nays, that the following resolutions were adopted:

#### **RESOLUTION ENDORSING WASTEWATER FACILITIES AND SERVICE AREAS MAP**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to state regulations, municipal water quality management plans must be in compliance with its regional wastewater management planning agency which, in the case of Dennis Township, requires the same be in compliance with the Cape May County Wastewater Management Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 17, 2012, the New Jersey State Legislature adopted an Act (P.L. 2011, c.203) requiring that, within 180 days, each wastewater management planning agency prepare and submit an existing and future sewer service area map to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection as a foundational document of the county's future wastewater management plan; and

**WHEREAS**, in conjunction with the Cape May County Planning Department the Township of Dennis has developed its Future Wastewater Facilities and Service Areas Map prepared by John C. Gibson, PE, dated June, 2012 (attached hereto); and

**WHEREAS**, at a duly advertised public meeting of the Dennis Township Planning Board occurring on May 24, 2012, the Dennis Township Planning Board adjusted and approved the Future Wastewater Facilities and Service Areas Map.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The allegations of the preamble are incorporated herein by this reference.

2. The Township Committee does hereby endorse the attached Future Wastewater Facilities and Service Areas Map for the purposes of delineating potential future wastewater facilities and service areas within the Township of Dennis for purposes of submission of same to the Cape May County Planning Department and New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.
3. A copy of this Resolution with the attached Wastewater Facilities and Service Areas Map be forwarded to the Cape May County Planning Department for their review and consideration.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2012-96**

**RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES  
AUTHORITY’S PROPOSED SWITCH OF THE CAPE MAY COUNTY  
INTERMEDIATE PROCESSING FACILITY TO SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING**

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act requires that at least 50% of the municipal solid waste stream and at least 60% of the total solid waste stream be recycled; and

**WHEREAS**, the Cape May County Recycling Plan, as adopted by the County Board of Chosen Freeholders and approved by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, sets forth an aggressive source separation and recycling program designed to achieve this State mandate; and

**WHEREAS**, the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority (“CMCMUA”) and all sixteen Cape May County municipalities have joined together in a regional, cooperative, source separation program to increase the types and quantity of recyclable materials recovered, maximize market revenues and minimize costs; and

**WHEREAS**, Cape May County Intermediate Processing Facility (“IPF”), which is the cornerstone of this regional program, facilitates the recycling of paper, bottles and cans (IPF Recyclables”) by residents, visitors, businesses and institutions through the convenience of mixing twenty different items into two streams for municipal collection; and

**WHEREAS**, the CMCMUA currently operates the IPF to receive, sort, upgrade and market IPF Recyclables collected by all municipalities in Cape May County; and

**WHEREAS**, municipal collection of IPF Recyclables has used two separate containers (know as dual stream) to accommodate the operation of the IPF since 1990; and

**WHEREAS**, the CMCMUA has solicited the opinion and commitment of Cape May County's municipalities to change their municipal source separation and recycling program and the County IPF to single stream, whereby all IPF Recyclables would be placed in a single container for municipal collection; and

**WHEREAS**, the switch from dual stream to single stream recycling in other municipalities in New Jersey has been shown to increase the quantity of materials recycled; and

**WHEREAS**, increased recycling conserves additional natural resources, conserves energy, reduces pollution, and extends the life of the Cape May County's only operating landfill; and

**WHEREAS**, implementation of single stream recycling will reduce municipal expenditures by collection of recyclables from a single recycling container instead of the current dual stream system; and

**WHEREAS**, the Shared Services Agreement for Solid Waste and Recycling executed between the Township of Dennis and the CMCMUA requires that all net revenue from the operation of the IPF be rebated to the County's municipalities in proportion to the total tons recycled by each municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, single stream recycling presents the potential for each of the County's municipalities to receive additional revenue in rebates from the CMCMUA, and from the State of New Jersey under the Recycling Tonnage Grant Program, as a result of any increased recycling tonnage; and

**WHEREAS**, any increased recycling tonnage realized by the switch to single stream recycling will save the municipality landfill disposal costs through avoidance of the tipping for every additional ton, or portion thereof, recycled; and

**WHEREAS**, single stream collection and processing makes recycling easier for the residents, visitors, and businesses of the Township of Dennis; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Dennis considers single stream recycling to be in the best interests of the municipality and its residents, visitors and businesses.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Township of Dennis hereby endorses the concept of switching from dual stream recycling to single stream recycling, for both the municipal recycling program and the County-wide recycling program, including the IPF.
2. The CMCMUA is urged to expeditiously proceed with the renovation of the IPF to enable the facility to handle and process single stream recyclables.
3. A copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the CMCMUA.

Let the record reflect that at this time Mayor Glembocki appointed Michael D. Haggerty, Sr. as the Emergency Management Coordinator for a three (3) year term.

Committeeman Murphy cautioned everyone to be careful with the extreme heat that is coming.

Committeeman DiCicco commented on Atlantic City Electric targeting the Route 83 area for tree trimming as well as working on Upper Township. He indicated that he was advised that there are not current plans to work in the Eldora area and perhaps they are just staging there. Committeeman DiCicco commended John Berg on doing a great job as the Emergency Management Coordinator and thanked him for all his hard work.

Committeeman Germanio thanked John Berg and indicated that Mr. Haggerty will have big shoes to fill. Committeeman Germanio commented on negotiations with Comcast to have Channel 2 as well as discussions regarding Comcast program to for certain qualifying families

to receive internet and computers at a reduced cost. He stated that link will be on the Township's website. Committeeman Germanio gave an update on South Jersey Gas's door to door survey to extend service. He indicated that within the next couple weeks he would be having a meeting with TRIAD Associates to look at grant opportunities.

Deputy Mayor Teefy thanked John Berg for his service and indicated that he has done an excellent job. He congratulated Mr. Haggerty on his appointment. Deputy Mayor Teefy commented on Summer Camp Program, summer basketball program and National Night Out. He indicated that we need donations to fund the fireworks display and that Recreation sent out a letter requesting donations from the businesses. He stated that he will give an update at the next meeting on how much we have received.

Mayor Glembocki echoed everyone thanks to John Berg for his service and that Mr. Haggerty has big shoes to fill. He asked them to work together for a smooth transition.
