AUGUST 21, 2012**

7:00 P.M. TWP. COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING

Mayor Glembocki opened the meeting in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act requirements and asked everyone to stand for the flag salute.

Mayor Glembocki asked for a moment of silence for our troops and any personal reasons and Committeeman DiCicco read a list of recent soldiers lost in Afghanistan and Iraq.

Mayor Glembocki requested that the Clerk carry the roll call over from the Board of Health Meeting (Mayor Glembocki with Committeemembers: DiCicco, Murphy, Germanio and Teefy present).

Motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Murphy, with 5 ayes and no nays, that the following Officer's Report were approved:

Tax Collector's Report - July, 2012

Motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Germanio, that the meeting be open for public comment. All in favor and the motion carried.

Eileen McFillin of 165 Cedar Lane West, South Dennis indicated that she wanted to make the public aware that \$35,000.00 in the budget came from reductions from just 3 employees and she indicated that she feels this was not fair and that it should have been taken from across the board and that \$35,000.00 from just 3 employees was 31% of their pay.

Walt Noll, 164 Gravel Hole Road commented on proposed Ordinance No. 2012-09 which creates certain restrictions and penalties related to the operation of all terrain vehicles, and discussions from the ATV Sub-Committee regarding ordinances you could "fashion" Dennis Township's after. Mr. Noll questioned with all the ordinances out there why would you fashion Dennis Township's after an older one such as Buena Vista Townships.

Mr. Donohue explained the use of Buena Vista's ordinance and gave a background.

Mr. Noll commented on ATV Sub-Committee meetings and working on the Buena Vista ordinance to make it more current and geared more towards Dennis Township. Mr. Noll indicated that during the meetings many issues were discussed and agreed upon, but do not appear in the introduced Ordinance and he questioned who this occurred.

Committeeman Germanio indicated that he understood Buena Vista's ordinance as being agreeable to Mr. Noll and indicated that they were addressing the issue in phases, Phase I being the proposed ordinance and Phase II going before the Planning Board.

Mr. Noll indicated that they do find Buena Vista's ordinance agreeable, but with modifications. He commented on the Phases.

Mr. Donohue indicated that he has reviewed all the information regarding the ATV issue and that it has been going on for years and that this Committee has taken action and is adopting an ordinance. He commented on addressing the issue in phases so that the Committee can address the police powers and the Planning Board can address just the zoning.

Mr. Noll continued to comment on Buena Vista's ordinance and questioned why some items were omitted in proposed Ordinance No. 2012-09.

Mr. Donohue indicated that the ordinance is what it is and that everyone had input into it and he could not pinpoint who wanted what in or out at this point.

Deputy Mayor Teefy indicated that he had looked at the Buena Vista ordinance and that Dennis Township was not Buena Vista and that he believes what we adopted fits Dennis Township. He indicated that he feels we can see how this works and make needed amendments down the line.

Mr. Donohue and Mr. Noll continued regarding the drafting of the proposed Ordinance No. 2012-09 and the differences with Buena Vista that were omitted.

Mr. Donohue and Committeeman Germanio reiterated that the Ordinance was focused on ATV operation.

Mr. Noll continued regarding items in Buena Vista's ordinance that are not in Ordinance No. 2012-09.

Christopher Castor of 34 Tressler Lane, commented on the ATV issue and the constitutionality of the ordinances to regulate ATV use. Mr. Castor indicated that he was proud to live in Dennis Township, not some other town. He stated that there is strong opposition to this ordinance and that there is no need for it because the State Law covers everything. Mr. Castor indicated that the USDA says you should cook your hamburger well but if you serve it medium-rare, you do not get a ticket and your grill impounded.

Daniel Nees of 1406 Route 47 commented on the passing of his son, Michael Fisher, at the Township Hockey Rink due to a heart condition. Mr. Nees indicated that if an AED had been close it may have saved his life. He commented on having AEDs at all the fields and possible legislation. Mr. Nees indicated that he was promised that there would be more AEDs available and to date that hasn't happened. He shared that a local business owner has offered to pay for an AED to give to the family so that they can donate it to the Hockey Association to have at the rink to possibly help save the next child. Mr. Nees questioned the status of the Township purchasing additional AEDs.

Deputy Mayor Teefy indicated that they were currently contacting the Township's Grant Coordinator, TRIAD Associates, to look into funding and that they were looking into ways to secure the AEDs at the fields. Mr. Nees recommend lock boxes were coaches can get them when they have practices and games.

Committeeman Germanio indicated that they will be speaking with the Auditor to look into including funds in the Capital Budget to cover the costs.

Mr. Nees stated that they will be donating the AED from them to the Hockey Association in September and asked if the Township will get a lock box to secure it.

Deputy Mayor Teefy discussed the some type of secure box outside that will be accessible to coaches when Recreation is closed and asked Mr. Nees to contact him later in the week after he had an opportunity to discuss it with the Recreation Director.

Mr. Nees indicated that he feels the AED are more important than whether a kids rides an ATV on his property and that the Committee should focus more on the AED issue.

Committeeman Murphy questioned when the Michael Fisher Walk was and Mr. Nees indicated that it is Saturday, September 22, 2012.

Committeeman DiCicco indicated that we have a gentleman, Brian Bushong, who wants to address the Committee and he commented on the new meeting format and stated residents wishing to comment on the Pines at Clermont should do so during this public comment portion since there is not public comment at the end of the meeting.

Justina Nees of 1406 Route 47 expressed her concerns on the way the issue of acquiring more AEDs was handled. She indicated that previous elected officials are blamed for the lack of funds and that candidates should have done their homework.

Deputy Mayor Teefy addressed her concerns and indicated that he would have loved to acquire more AEDs right away, however, he was not aware fiscal situation the Township was in.

Mrs. Nees continued with her concerns on the way the issue was handled. She and Deputy Mayor Teefy commented on discussions they had regarding the issue. Mrs. Nees commented on her discussions with Senator Van Drew regarding legislation.

Brian Bushong of 1577 Route 83 read a letter into the record to the Committee regarding the excessive speed of motorist on Gravel Hole Road. He submitted a petition for the installation of 2 speed bumps along Gravel Hole Road and signage indicated "No thru traffic". He commented on the speed bumps that are located in Upper Township. Mr. Bushong asked the Committee to be "proactive" and install the speed bumps before we have to have a memorial.

Committeeman Germanio requested a copy of Mr. Bushong's letter so that he could forward it to the Station Commander at the Woodbine State Police Barracks.

Mr. Bushong commented on the Police presence and indicated that as soon as they leave the cars speed up.

Mr. Donohue indicated that he signed the petition and commented on the process under Title 39 and the design standard that must be sent up to the NJDOT. He indicated that the Township would need a cost estimate.

Township Engineer, Jack Gibson, indicated that he would look into it and get a cost estimate.

Mayor Glembocki asked that Mr. Gibson also contact the County Engineer regarding signage out on County Route 657 indicating "No thru Traffic" or "local traffic only".

Mr. Donohue commented on the motorist going down Gravel Hole Road to avoid the lights.

Gary Gibson of 158 Gravel Hole Road commented on correspondence requesting an interpretation of allowable uses for a property in the Business Zone.

Mr. Donohue reiterated that the Committee was holding off on referring and thing regarding the Zoning part until they had addressed the policing powers part.

Mr. Gibson commented on: a letter from the Planning Board Solicitor, Mr. Corrado; the ATV ordinances from Buena Vista and Middle Township and he indicated that a scalpel had been taken to the one we introduced; and property damage and noise as it pertains to ATV use.

Committeeman Germanio and Mr. Donohue discussed other laws that address the property damage issues.

Mr. Gibson commented on not receiving an answer from Mr. Stevens, Chairperson of the Planning Board.

Monique James of 50 Cedar Drive, Ocean View commented on obtaining additional AEDs.

Committeeman Germanio, Deputy Mayor Teefy, Ms. James and Mr. Nees discussed AEDs.

Alma George and her father, Jim Waltz, questioned the status of their request to have interested refunded due to an issue with their tax bill because of a sub-division being filed.

Mr. Donohue indicated that he had researched the issue and indicated that the Committee does not have the authority to waive the interest.

Mrs. George questioned why the Natural Resources Committee meetings were not advertised.

Mr. Donohue indicated that the Natural Resources Committee were not subject to the Open Public Meeting Act.

Committeeman Germanio indicated that their meeting would be held the 3rd Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m.

Michele Heim, Dennis Township Tax Collector, commented on Mrs. George & Mr. Waltz's tax payment/interest concerns.

Gerry Rescigno of 31 Alexandra's Way indicated that a group of residents are here this evening because of questions regarding the Pines at Clermont and asked if there will be a public comment portion on the Pines at Clermont presentation.

The Committee asked the Solicitor if that would be allowed and he indicated yes.

Mr. Donohue commented on the filming of Dark Shield and advised the Committee that if anyone had any questions, Kristy Richman was available to answer them.

Dan Konczyk of 60 Lake Vista Drive commented on the Pines at Clermont project and the legality of having a resolution regarding it on the Committee agenda prior to an application going before the Planning/Zoning Board.

Mr. Donohue labeled it as odd and explained the two different ordinances that are involved, the Campground Ordinance and Land Use. Mr. Donohue and Mr. Konczyk commented further on this issue regarding the Pines at Clermont.

Mr. Donohue gave a history on the production company filming the “Dark Shield” and the explosion of a car on private property in the Belleplain section of the Township. Kristy Richman, Mr. Donohue and the Committee discussed the requirements from the State and the Township.

There being no further comments from those present, motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Germanio, that the public comment portion be closed. The motion carried.

The Committee discussed with the Clerk correspondence from the N.J. Dept. of Agriculture regarding the Application for Survey of Gypsy Moth Egg Masses. Motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Germanio, that the Municipal Clerk complete the application requesting the survey for gypsy moth egg masses. The motion carried.

The Committee discussed the correspondence from the Tri-County Sportsmen Motorcycle Club, Inc. regarding their 2012 Dual Sport Hammer Run on November 3 – 4, 2012. The Committee instructed the Clerk to place a resolution on the next agenda.

Committeeman Germanio discussed with the Committee an Inter-Local Agreement with the School District for the parking of school buses on Township property

The Committee discussed correspondence from the City of Bridgeton regarding their request for Dennis Township to forward a “letter of concurrence” in respect to their application to the FCC for a license on 154.9875 MHz. Mr. Donohue updated the Committee on the reasons requiring the need for a letter of concurrence. A motion was made by Teefy, seconded by DiCicco, that the Mayor send a letter of concurrence to the City of Bridgeton. The motion carried.

At this time representatives from the Pines at Clermont, James Pickering, Esq. and Steve Filippone, gave a presentation on their request to the Township Committee for conditional approval of a Campground License for the Pines at Clermont, Block 256.05, Lot 14.01 & 15.01.

Mr. Donohue indicated that Committeeman Murphy and Deputy Mayor Teefy have identified potential conflicts and will abstain and not participate. Mr. Donohue commented on the status of the 15th Campground License and that an application has been submitted and must be dealt with. Mr. Donohue commented on different sections of Chapter 75.

Mr. Pickering commented on the requirements under Chapter 75-Campgrounds and Chapter 185-Zoning.

Mr. Filippone commented on the golfing industry.

Committeeman DiCicco and Mr. Pickering discussed the relevancy of Mr. Filippone's comments.

Mr. Pickering and Mr. Filippone commented on the economical benefits of having the property be a campground vs. a golf course.

Mr. Pickering and Mr. Filippone continued with their review of the requirements.

Mr. Pickering, Mr. Filippone and Committeeman DiCicco discussed septic systems.

Mr. Pickering and Mr. Filippone continued with their review of the requirements.

Mr. Donohue and Mr. Pickering discussed the requirement regarding 40 acres.

Mr. Pickering discussed with the Township Committee that they were present this evening requesting that the Township Committee assign the 15th Campground License to the Pines at Clermont so that they can go before the Land Use Board for any and all required approvals and waivers.

Mr. Pickering and Mr. Filippone commented on the process.

Mr. Pickering and Mr. Filippone continued with their review of the requirements.

Mr. Pickering commented on campgrounds being the biggest industry in Dennis Township as well as the 40 acre requirement. Mr. Pickering shared a proposed site plan of the layout.

The Committee asked Mr. Pickering various questions such as will the golf course stay open to the public, how many residences would be affected, number of campgrounds already in the area, traffic, water usage, and making the public aware.

Motion was made by DiCicco, seconded by Germanio, that this issue be open for public comment. Comments were heard from: James Waltz, Dan Konczyk, Terri Costantini, Judy Waterbury, Dennis Crippen, Norm Waterbury, Wendy Kraye, and Gerry Rescigno regarding various issues such as: the number of sites with density, why Committeemen Teefy & Murphy were abstaining, the format, differences between running a golf course and a campground, the residences assessments, sewerage, water usage, number of campgrounds, the management of the golf course, maintenance concerns, lot size averaging, smoke from campfires, fencing, concerns with rushing into this, the 50% wooded requirement, and vandalism. Mr. Pickering responded to some of the concerns.

Mr. Donohue commented on making a referral to the Land Use Board and Mr. Pickering commented their request for a conditional approval as well as the costs associated with going before the Board. Mr. Donohue commented on their concern of going before the Land Use Board, paying all the costs associated with that and then coming back to the Township Committee and then being denied.

Mr. Donohue and Mr. Pickering discussed concerns with the language in the proposed resolution and the resolution being non-binding.

Mayor Glembocki commented on everyone thinking about this issue and indicated that he would like to have it tabled for tonight to allow everyone more time to review it.

Committeeman Germanio commented on allowing a site inspection by the Township Committee Members.

Mr. Donohue indicated that the record should reflect the following: the application is dated 06/18/2012 and that he and Mr. Pickering had informal conversations regarding it. He indicated that he had reviewed some history with the Clerk, had this been done before, denial vs. revoked. He commented on all the questions as well as the areas of zoning being addressed within Chapter 75, the Campground code and reiterated that once an application comes in it has to be dealt with.

Committeeman DiCicco asked if the clock was ticking with this application and Mr. Donohue indicated that it was not and he commented again on the oddness of the application and Chapter 75.

Mr. Donohue commented on the tabling the issue and the timeframe to go before the Land Use Board.

Committeeman DiCicco commented on tabling the issue and Mr. Pickering could fine-tune the presentation and we could have the public better represented.

Committeeman Germanio questioned what would happen if someone else came to the Committee in the interim for a Campground License. Mr. Donohue indicated that they are done on a first come, first serve basis.

Mr. Donohue and Mr. Pickering discussed meeting schedules, Township Committee & Land Use Board.

Motion was made by Glembocki, seconded by Germanio, with 3 ayes and 2 abstaining (Murphy & Teefy) that Resolution No. 2012-112 be tabled.

Mayor Glembocki read Resolution Nos. 2012-108, 2012-110 and 2012-111 by title and asked for a motion to adopt.

Let the record reflect that the following Resolution Nos. 2012-108, 2012-110 and 2012-111 were part of a consent agenda with a block roll call vote.

Motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Germanio, with 5 ayes and no nays, that the following resolutions were adopted:

Mr. Donohue explained that there will be open discussion regarding the title Zoning Board Administrative Officer & Planning Board Administrative Officer due to the employee requesting that the discussions be in open session.

Mayor Glembocki indicated that we will now have the open session discussion regarding the Zoning Board Administrative Officer & Planning Board Administrative Officer.

Bill Blaney, Esq. commented on the issue of an employee receiving two separate stipends one for the Zoning Board Administrative Officer and one for the Planning Board Administrative Officer and the fact that the Township has abolished the Zoning Board of Adjustment and vested its powers to the Planning Board. Mr. Blaney commented on the practice of paying stipends for additional titles.

Committeeman Murphy indicated that he has some ideas that might help budget wise and asked that the Committee table making a decision until he discusses his ideas with the Auditor.

Committeeman DiCicco, indicated that he had no comments at this time.

Committeeman Germanio commented on the Natural Resources Committee meeting and indicated that they will be the 3rd Monday of the month.

Deputy Mayor Teefy indicated that he had no comment at this time.

Committeeman Germanio advised the Committee that he will be unavailable for the 1st meeting in October.

Deputy Mayor Teefy commented on National Night Out and indicated that everything was great. Deputy Mayor Teefy extended his thanks to all the sponsors who contributed.

Mayor Glembocki indicated that he had no comment at this time.

Motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Teefy, that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried.
