7:00 P.M. TWP. COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING

Mayor Glembocki opened the meeting in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act requirements.

Mayor Glembocki asked that everyone stand for the flag salute.

Mayor Glembocki asked for a moment of silence for our troops and any personal reasons.

Committeeman DiCicco read the list of soldiers recently lost in Afghanistan and Iraq as well as Ambassador Chris Stevens and staff who died during the assault on the American Consulate in Benghazi.

Mayor Glembocki presided with Committee Members: DiCicco, Murphy, Germanio and Teefy present.

Motion was made by Murphy, seconded by Teefy, with 5 ayes and no nays, that the following Officer's Report were approved:

Tax Collector's Report - August, 2012

Motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Germanio, that the following correspondence be received and filed: 1) Letter from the N.J. Dept. of Agriculture regarding no major infestations of gypsy moth and 2) Letter from the CMCMUA regarding Single Stream Recycling.

Motion was made by Germanio, seconded by DiCicco, that the meeting be open for public comment. All in favor and the motion carried.

Norman Waterbury of Alexandra Way questioned the status of the Pines at Clermont and Mayor Glembocki indicated that the Township has not heard back from them. Mr. Waterbury questioned if the public are allowed at the Planning Board Meetings and can they speak. The Committee assured him that they could and that residents within 200 feet will be notified.

Terri Costantini of Alexandra Way advised the Committee that surveyors have been on the property at the Pines at Clermont. She questioned being notified of the Planning Board Meeting and Committeeman DiCicco indicated only if you live within 200 feet and so everyone must be alert.

There being no further comments from those present, motion was made by Germanio, seconded by Teefy, that the public comment portion be closed. The motion carried.

Committeeman Germanio updated the Committee on the status of the South Jersey Gas Company's Petersburg Road Project. The Committee discussed said project.

RESOLUTION NO. 2012-117

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A
PROMISE OF INDEMNIFICATION WITH THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY
FOR THE TEMPORARY PLACEMENT OF HOLIDAY WREATHS ABOVE
PETERSBURG ROAD AND MAIN STREET IN DENNISVILLE**

WHEREAS, the Township has requested that the County of Cape May permit temporary placement of holiday wreaths on utility poles above portions of County Route 610 (Petersburg Road and Main Street) in Dennisville; and

WHEREAS, the Holiday Wreath Project would last approximately November 19, 2012 thru January 08, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Township has been notified by the County Engineer that the County requires the Township to execute a Promise of Indemnification in order to process our request.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Promise of Indemnification so that the County of Cape May can approve the temporary placement of Holiday Wreaths above a portion of County Route 610 (Petersburg Road and Main Street) in Dennisville.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution shall accompany the executed Promise of Indemnification to the County Engineer's Office.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DENNIS, COUNTY OF CAPE MAY AND
STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2011-03,
ESTABLISHING THE COMPENSATION OF THE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF
THE TOWNSHIP OF DENNIS**

Section1. Preamble

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis adopted Ordinance 2011-03 in 2011 in accordance with law to set ranges of salary for certain titles; and

WHEREAS, as a result of certain changes in certain positions, Ordinance 2011-03 requires amendment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, that Ordinance 2011-03, be and hereby is amended as follows:

Section 2. [Changes follow. Strike through indicates language eliminated from ordinance. Double underlined and bold indicates language added to ordinance. The remainder of Ordinance 2011-03 is unchanged. Note: It is typical for some titles to be unfilled, yet remain in the ordinance as a contingency.]

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with the law.

Section 4. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to the portion of the Ordinance actually adjudged invalid and shall not be deemed to affect the operation of any other portion thereof, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.
