**7:00 P.M. TWP. COMMITTEE WORKSESSION/REGULAR MEETING**

Mayor Glembocki opened the meeting in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act requirements.

Mayor Glembocki requested the roll call. The Clerk called the roll with: DiCicco, Murphy, Germanio, Teefy and Glembocki present.

Mayor Glembocki asked that everyone please stand for the flag salute, moment of silence and reading of the names of the lost soldiers.

Committeeman DiCicco read the names of the fallen soldiers.

Mayor Glembocki indicated that at this time we will hold the Public Hearing on Dennis Township Fire District #1 Defeated Budget pursuant to N.J.S. 40A:14-79.

Mayor Glembocki asked if there were any representative from the Fire District who wishes to be heard on the budget to please come forward and state your name and address for the record.

Joseph Wilshire, Financial Advisor to Fire District #1, shared some statistical comparisons with other fire districts in the County and information regarding their budget process. Mr. Wilshire closed with some personal observations.

Mayor Glembocki asked if any other members of the Fire District wished to comment. Let the record reflect that there was none.

Mayor Glembocki asked if any members of the public wished to comment on the Defeated Fire District #1 Budget and indicated that they may do so now by coming forward to the microphone and stating your name and address for the record. He reiterated that this is for comments on the fire district budget only.

There being no members of the public wishing to comment, Mayor Glembocki asked if any members of the Committee have any comments regarding the Defeated Fire District #1 Budget.

Committeeman DiCicco commended Mr. Wilshire on a great summary and commented on the motivation of voters. He indicated that he knows the guys in Ocean View do a great job and respects Mr. Wilshire's observation, however it is very difficult to evaluate the voters.

Deputy Mayor Teefy indicated that he agrees with Committeeman DiCicco and commented on how difficult it is for the Committee to look at the Fire District Budget and say what it should or shouldn't be. He indicated that for whatever reasons the voters voted the budget down and it needs to be looked at. Deputy Mayor Teefy indicated that the defeated budget was increased

approximately \$13,000.00 from last year and that last year the voters approved that figure and perhaps we should go back to the figure the voters approved last year.

Committeeman DiCicco questioned Mr. Wilshire on the affect cutting the \$13,000.00 from the Budget and Mr. Wilshire explained.

Deputy Mayor Teefy commented on the affect the cut would have on the financial plan and the voters having voted the budget down.

Committeeman Germanio advised Mr. Wilshire that he was very informative and that the fire district was lucky to have him. He indicated that for whatever reasons the voters voted the way that they did and that he agrees with Deputy Mayor Teefy that we should go back to the budget amount that the voters last agreed to because the voters have spoken.

Committeeman Murphy likened the defeated fire district budget to a defeated school budget and indicated that when the voters vote down a budget you have to make some kind of adjustment. He commented on the \$13,000.00 being a cut that we can live with.

Mr. Wilshire commented on the affect if future budgets continue to be voted down.

Mayor Glembocki commented on Mr. Wilshire's explanation and the need for posting the information on the website so people can be better informed. He indicated that the Township has dedicated firefighters who respond day and night.

Committeeman Germanio invited Mr. Wilshire to attend Township Committee meetings and announce with fire district meeting are and what will be discussed so that it will be on the record.

Mr. Wilshire commented on his involvement.

Mayor Glembocki reiterated about getting the information out to the public.

Deputy Mayor Teefy commented on the budgets being voted on every year to give a choice to the people and educating the people.

Jon Frasca of Fidler Road in Dennisville commended Mr. Wilshire for his information and hard work. He commented on the publics' lack of attendance to fire district meeting and comments on the budget and indicated that it is due to the public not having knowledge about it. He applauded the Township Committee for listening to the voters and cutting the budget. Mr. Frasca commented on the donation request that he receives every year and indicated that information regarding the fire district election and budget could be gotten to him as well as it could be placed on the signs out front of the firehouses. Mr. Frasca commented on the age of the equipment. Mr. Frasca closed his comments with indicated that he has a lot of respect for Mr. Wilshire.

Committeeman DiCicco commended Mr. Wilshire for his information and indicated that long-term his presentation will be helpful.

Mayor Glembocki commented on the mandate requiring fire districts information on the website and our districts having websites off of the Township website which contains meeting dates, etc.

Mayor Glembocki asked for a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2013-43 – Regarding the 2013 Dennis Township Fire District #1 Budget. Motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Germanio with 5 ayes and no nays that the following resolution was adopted:

**RESOLUTION NO. 2013-43**

**RESOLUTION REGARDING THE 2013 DENNIS TOWNSHIP  
FIRE DISTRICT #1 BUDGET**

**WHEREAS**, at the regular election of the Dennis Township Fire District #1 - Station 17, held on February 16, 2013 the voters of the fire district rejected the proposed budget of \$368,000.00 submitted by the Board of Fire Commissioners for the tax levy fire purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. A40A:14-78.5, the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis received the proposed fire budget and supporting documentation from the Board of Fire Commissioners on February 19, 2013 consulted with said Board of Fire Commissioners with respect to the defeated budget; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14 - 78.5, all of the proper notices for this meeting have been given, and a public hearing on the rejected budget having been held on March 05, 2013 by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee has reviewed the matter carefully and being required, pursuant to the aforesaid statute, to certify to the Cape May County Board of Taxation the amount necessary for general fund expenses to provide a thorough and efficient fire system in the district.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, Cape May County, New Jersey, as follows:

1. The allegations statements of the preamble are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.
2. After the public hearing, which included discussion with the Dennis Township Fire District #1 – Station 17, it was agreed that deductions to the proposed budget, as noted, could be made without jeopardizing the ability for a thorough and efficient fire system public safety in the Township.
3. The Township Committee of the Township of Dennis in the County of Cape May and the State of New Jersey hereby certifies that pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. A40A:14-79, the amount necessary for the general fund expenses for the fire district to provide a thorough and efficient fire system fire fighting services in the Township of Dennis is \$355,000 (total budget amount) of which a total of \$355,000 shall be raised by tax levy. calculated as follows:

Original tax levy submitted to voters \$368,000

Deductions made by Committee \$ -13,000

Reserve for Future Capital Outlays

Tax levy for general fund expenses \$355,000

Mayor Glembocki indicated that also have discussion on the 2013 Budget. He indicated that he believed all departments have their budgets in and he asked that if any Committee Member have any thoughts regarding their departments budgets to send him an email and they can discuss it individually.

Mayor Glembocki asked for a motion to adjourn the worksession and open the regular meeting, motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Germanio, with all in favor.

Mayor Glembocki indicated that the Committee would now have the public comment period on our Agenda items and anyone wishing to address the Committee on the Agenda items may do so at this time by coming forward and stating their name and address for the record.

There being no comment from the public on agenda items, motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Germanio with all in favor that the public comment on agenda items be closed.

Mayor Glembocki questioned the Committee if they had any questions or concerns with the consent agenda.

Committeeman DiCicco commented on the Comcast bills and Mayor Glembocki and Committeeman Germanio commented on Comcast issues.

Mayor Glembocki asked for a motion adopting the consent agenda, motion was made by Teefy, seconded by Murphy, with 5 ayes and no nays, that the consent agenda be adopted.

November 20, 2012 (Regular Meeting) were apart of the consent agenda and hereby approved.

The following motion was apart of the consent agenda and hereby approved: Authorizing the Mayor to Forward a letter to the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority to request their assistance with the Recycling Tonnage Grant and Authorizing the Clerk to Post the Request for Proposals for Alt. **RESOLUTION NO. 2013-45**

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RECYCLING COORDINATOR TO  
SUBMIT THE 2012 TONNAGE GRANT**

**WHEREAS**, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c. 102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grants may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent and spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and expand existing programs; and

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection is promulgating recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

**WHEREAS**, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including, but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for such tonnage grants will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and indicate the assent of the Township Committee to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure that the application is properly completed and timely filed.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, that the Township of Dennis hereby endorses the submission of a Municipal Recycling Tonnage Grant Application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Office of Recycling and designates John C. Gibson, Municipal Engineer, 571 Petersburg Road, P.O. Box 204, Dennisville, NJ 08214, to ensure that the said application is properly filed.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the monies received from the Recycling Tonnage Grant be used solely for the purposes of recycling.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2013-46**

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY FOR THE REVIEW AND SUBMISSION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DENNIS' 2012 ANNUAL RECYCLING TONNAGE REPORT**

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 13:1E-96 5.b(1), commencing in 2012, each New Jersey municipality is required by the Recycling Enhancement Act ("REA") to have mandatory Annual Recycling Tonnage Reports approved and signed by a Certified Recycling Professional ("CRP"); and

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey (State) requires that municipalities submit their Annual Recycling Tonnage Reports by April 30 of each year; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Dennis (Township) will not be able to secure the Shared Services Agreement prior to April 30, 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority (Authority) has one or more employees that have obtained designation as a CRP; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority has indicated a willingness to assist the Township of Dennis in securing their rightful recycling fund allotment from the State for its 2012 recycling activities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority desires to memorialize each party's responsibilities in a Shared Services Agreement pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.) ("Shared Services Act"), whereby the Authority would review, certify, and submit, via email, to the NJDEP, the Township of Dennis' 2012 Recycling Tonnage Report; and

**WHEREAS**, under the Shared Services Act, any local unit may enter into an agreement with any other local unit or units to provide and/or receive any service that each local unit participating in the agreement is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction, including services incidental to the primary purposes of any of the participating local units; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, as follows:

1. The Township of Dennis hereby approves the "Shared Services Agreement Between the Township of Dennis and the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority to Review, Sign/Submit the 2012 Annual Recycling Report", in substantially the same form as currently on file with the Municipal Clerk.
2. The Mayor is authorized to execute said Agreement.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2013-47**

**RESOLUTION SETTING FORTH THE SPECIAL EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION PURSUANT TO N.J.S. 40A:4-55**

**WHEREAS**, it has been found necessary to make an Emergency Appropriation to meet certain extraordinary expenses incurred, or to be incurred, by the preparation and execution of a complete program of revaluation of real property for the use of the local Assessor, or of any program to update and make current any previous revaluation program when such is ordered by the County Board of Taxation and for tax map updates/revisions; and

**WHEREAS**, NJS 40A:4-53 provides that it shall be lawful to make such appropriation, which appropriation and/or the “special emergency notes” issued to finance the same shall be provided for in succeeding annual budgets by the inclusion of an appropriation of at least one-fifth of the amount authorized pursuant to this act.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** (by not less than two-thirds of all governing body members affirmatively concurring) that in accordance with the provisions of NJS 40A:4-55:

1. An emergency appropriation is hereby made for the preparation and execution of a complete program of revaluation of real property for the use of the local Assessor, or of any program to update and make current any previous revaluation program when such is ordered by the County Board of Taxation and for tax map updates/revisions in the total amount of \$350,000.00.
2. That the emergency appropriation shall be provided for in the budgets of the next succeeding years by the inclusion of not less than \$70,000.00.
3. That an “emergency note”, not in excess of the amount authorized pursuant to law, be provided.
4. That such note shall be executed by Glenn O. Clarke, Chief Financial Officer.
5. That said note shall be dated when deemed necessary, may be renewed from time to time provided that such note and any renewals shall mature and be paid in the amount of not less than one-fifth of the total amount appropriated by this resolution in each year after the authorization. To be determined. (insert further detail, i.e. place of payment)
6. That the statement required by the Local Finance Board has been filed with the Clerk and a copy will be transmitted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.
7. That two (2) certified copies of this resolution will be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services; however, no approval is required from the Division.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER FOR RECYCLING COORDINATOR SERVICES**

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, finding it in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Township to enter into a Shared Services Agreement, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit A, with the Township of Upper for the provision of Recycling Coordinator services; and

**WHEREAS**, such interlocal Shared Services Agreements are encouraged by the State of New Jersey, as codified at NJSA 40A:65-1 et seq., the New Jersey Shared Services Act; and

**WHEREAS**, entering into this agreement will result in a savings; will allow the Township of Dennis to advance the Recycling Coordinator function which has been lacking and may help to generate a greater reimbursement from the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority in connection with recycling tonnage; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Upper has been a cooperative partner in this effort and this agreement will continue to foster good will and productive avenues for more efficient government by and between the Township of Upper and the Township of Dennis;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, duly assembled in public session this 5<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2013, as follows:

1. The Preamble of this Resolution is herein adopted and made the findings of the Township Committee;
2. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute the agreement on behalf of the Township of Dennis for the purpose aforesaid;
3. That a copy of this Resolution, along with a copy of the agreement, be sent to the Clerk of the Township of Upper with a request for similar action by the Township of Upper.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2013-50**

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RECEIPT OF BIDS FOR THE SALE OF ONE  
(1) NEW PLENARY RETAIL CONSUMPTION LICENSE FOR THE SALE OF  
ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DENNIS**

**WHEREAS**, the voters of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey approved a referendum permitting the sale of alcoholic beverages in the Township of Dennis; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the U.S. Bureau of the Census Resident Population Estimate, the population of the Township of Dennis permits the sale of one (1) new plenary retail distribution license and two (2) new plenary retail consumption license; and

**WHEREAS**, there are currently one (1) plenary retail consumption license issued in the Township of Dennis; and

**WHEREAS**, it has been deemed necessary and desirable to issue the remaining plenary retail consumption license and to sell same at public sale.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, the municipal issuing authority for the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The appropriate township officials are hereby authorized to issue a new retail plenary consumption license for the sale of alcoholic beverages.
2. The new license shall be sold using the public sale option in the Intoxicating Liquors Law (N.J.A. 33:1-1 et seq.).
3. The Township will accept open bids for acquisition of the license from any interested party. The sale shall take place on May 15, 2013 at 3:00 p.m.
4. An opening bid of \$500,000.00 shall be required.
5. Each bidder shall be qualified to have an interest in a retail alcoholic license under the standards set forth by the New Jersey Alcoholic Beverage Control Act, the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder, and any applicable Township Ordinance.
6. A bidders list of qualified bidders shall be prepared at 10:00 a.m. on May 15, 2013 by the Municipal Clerk. In order to become a qualified bidder a person shall (a) prepare an affidavit of qualification for ownership interest in or association with a New Jersey Alcoholic Beverage License or Permit; and (b) provide a certified or cashiers check in the amount of \$50,000.00 representing a deposit.
7. The deposit of the highest two (2) bidders shall be retained by the Municipal Clerk. All others will be returned on the date of the bid.
8. The successful bidder shall provide the balance of the purchase price within 21 days of the bid. Failure to submit the required monies within the designated time frame shall result in disqualification of the bid and the second highest bidder shall be notified and have 21 days to provide the balance of the purchase price. In the event that the difference is greater than \$50,000.00, then the deposit of the first highest bidder shall be retained as liquidated damages by the Township. If the difference of the second highest bid is less than \$50,000.00, then the difference shall be retained by the Township as liquidated damages and the balance refunded to the first highest bidder within fourteen (14) days. In the

event that the first highest bidder pays the balance then the deposit check of the second highest bidder shall be forthwith returned. On the date of the final payment the successful bidder shall also submit the required state form.

9. In the event that neither the first or second highest bidder pays the balance, then the Township shall establish a new sale date and procedures.
10. Upon payment of the balance of the highest bid the Township shall award the license to the bidder as a Person to Person Transfer. A determination of where the license will actually be sited will be determined as a Place to Place Transfer.
11. The Township Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to forthwith send a copy of this Resolution and Notice to Bidders to the Cape May County Chamber of Commerce and to any individual who has submitted any requests for information received by the Township Clerk.
12. The Township Clerk be and is hereby authorized and directed to purchase a block advertisement at least sixty (60) days and again at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the receipt of bids advertising the sale of the said new plenary retail distribution license in the Atlantic City Press, the Philadelphia Inquirer, the Cape May County Herald and the Courier Post.
