It is time to re-affirm your membership in the Atlantic County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund for the period beginning January 1, 2014.

ACMJIF Membership Agreement

Please place the attached *Resolution for Renewal of Membership in the ACMJIF* on your next agenda for adoption. In order to ensure a smooth budget and renewal process for the JIF, we ask that you forward your renewal resolution and the attached *Agreement to Renew Membership in the ACMJIF* to our office by August 15, 2013. Your prompt response will enable the Finance Committee to develop a realistic 2014 Fund Year budget in a timely manner.

As you consider your continuing membership in the JIF, we would like to invite you to discuss any questions directly with our staff so that we have an opportunity to frankly reply to your needs.

If you intend to compare the JIF to other programs, we ask that you please contact our office. Comparing insurance programs can be a difficult and confusing process. One thing is for sure; all insurance and all JIFs are not alike. Items to be considered include financial stability, coverage, limits, deductibles, co-insurance requirements, programs, and services. If you intend to conduct a marketing exercise, we recommend that you begin the process immediately so as to meet the Fund's August 15th date.

Discounts for Renewing Members

The JIF recognizes the need to hold on to members who have contributed to our financial success and we have developed programs designed to reward renewing members whose claims experience has been above average. For members who have had less favorable experience, we have developed loss sensitive programs that can reduce your renewal premium and allow your future claims experience to determine your ultimate premium. The JIF will also consider high deductible or SIR programs as a way of reducing premiums for members who qualify. Please contact our office if you wish to discuss any of these options.

Dividends

We are pleased to report that the JIF returned \$750,000 to our members this past year and in excess of \$24,000,000 since the JIF's inception. These dividends would have been insurance company profits. Return of surplus is made possible because of the conservative nature of the JIF operations and because every penny not spent on claims is returned to our members with interest!

Additional Services

As you know, the JIF will not be out-serviced. Our safety and claims management services are second to none. The JIF also provides its members with training seminars on important issues such as Police, Public Officials, and Employment Liability. Each of these programs has been enthusiastically received by all who have attended. In addition to the superior safety, liability, and claims management services mentioned above, the JIF offers many other valuable member benefits. For example, the JIF provides *Property Appraisals* for all members and has made discounts available for your Fixed Asset Inventory reports. The *Employment Practices Liability Helpline* is another member service that has been implemented to assist you in addressing employment issues before they become lawsuits.

Member Visitation Program

In the near future, our office will begin contacting renewing members to schedule a meeting with you and representatives of your governing body. **RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A MEETING NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN
ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE
NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12**

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq; and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 b and designated below:

- (1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual, unless the individual concerned (or in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease of Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving, the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
- (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.
- (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting. Matters Relating to Employment Relationships – Part-time Seasonal Temporary Keyboarding Clerk I.
- (9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, assembled in public session on August 05, 2013, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held on August 05, 2013 prior to the close of the above night's meeting in the Dennis Township Municipal Complex, 571 Petersburg Road, Dennisville, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designed above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

I am helping to secure reimbursement from the Pinelands Commission for the costs to include their regulations in the new zoning ordinance. I am also working on resolving the zoning limit discrepancies between those in their files and our ordinance.

I am preparing the 2014 DOT Municipal Aid application for improving the intersection of Fidler Road and Academy Road in Dennisville. After discussing the project with the local aid engineer, the project should have a higher priority since we own the necessary right of way. According to records in the Tax Office the Township foreclosed on a 1957 tax lien on lot 1, block 70 in 1993.
