4:30 P.M. (PREVAILING TIME) TWP. COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING

Mayor Murphy opened the meeting in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act requirements.

Mayor Murphy requested that the roll call and flag salute be carried over from the Board of Health Meeting (DiCicco, Salimbene, Tozer, O'Connor and Murphy present).

Mayor Murphy indicated that there were people present who wanted to comment on proposed Resolution Nos. 2015-80 & 81, which supported the ARC's applications for grants and called Diann forward.

Diann Walters of 1 Scotty Drive commented on The ARC applying for grants and indicated that the neighbors were ok with it as long and the funds are used to repair the property and that they stay within the confines of the 1989 Land Use Board Resolution and it is not moved towards any commercial use of the property. Committeeman DiCicco indicated that he had reviewed one of the applications and it is for repairs to the building. He also stated that no matter what they do to the property, they would still be required to go before the Land Use Board for a variance to change the use. Township Solicitor, Jeff April, indicated that he had reviewed the Historic Trust Application and it appears that it is all for maintenance for the building. Ms. Walters indicated that the neighbors would be fine with Township Committee Resolutions supporting the ARC's grant applications as long as they had language regarding adhering to the 1989 Land Use Board conditions.

Pat Boylan of 1 Scotty Drive commented on the applications and indicated that he is concerned with what they don't say. He commented on other applications to the Land Use Board (storage building, parking lot, etc.) and asked the Committee to watch the list. Committeeman DiCicco commented on viewing the applications when they are public. Mr. Boylan indicated that the neighborhood was residential zone and wants it to stay that. He voiced concern over the lawn care business already being run at the ARC. Mayor Murphy commented on there being mistrust and keeping the neighbors in the loop.

James Pickering, Esq. indicated that he represents the ARC and stated that they have no problem with the Resolutions reflecting language indicated that they will not expand upon previous Land Use Board approvals. He indicated that there have been two (2) previous Land Use Board approvals not just the 1989 one and to include any and all previous Land Use Board approvals. Committeeman DiCicco indicated that the neighbors' concerns are with making sure the ARC stay within the conditions of the 1989 approval. Mr. April indicated that the language in the resolutions is in the plural. Mr. Pickering offered to answer any questions. Committeeman DiCicco commented on sending the Code Enforcement Officer out to investigate the lawn care business complaint. Mr. Pickering indicated that he had stopped by the office. He commented on the activities that go on at the ARC have been approved by the Land Use Board. Mayor Murphy stated that he believes a lot of the issues have come from misunderstanding and he feels that the neighbors care about the ARC, however they care about their neighborhood as well. He stated that the Committee supports the ARC and the residents. Mayor Murphy indicated that he hopes the leadership at the ARC builds up the relationship with the neighbors. Mr. Pickering indicated that the ARC is seeking support from the Committee for the grants to repair/maintain the property. Committeeman DiCicco questioned when the public could view the grant applications and Mr. Pickering indicated that will be filed by June 25th. Mr. Pickering commented on the applications.

Pat Boylan questioned the ARC's previous approvals and Mr. Pickering indicated that he believed it to be approximately 2012 or 2013 and the approval for the storage building allowed them to operate the lawn care. Mr. Pickering commented on the last application from the Fall of 2014 that was withdrawn out of respect to the neighbors and their concerns about the project.

Diann Walters stated that the application for the storage building clearly stated that it was for storage only and did not indicate anywhere that they could run a lawn care program out of it and that is why the neighbors believe they do not have all the proper approvals to be running a business. Committeeman DiCicco indicated that it has been turned over to Code Enforcement for review.

Committeewoman Salimbene questioned if the lawn care equipment is stored in the building. Mr. Pickering indicated that the landscaping equipment is stored there and commented on the work program that is run for the clients.

Pat Boylan commented on what the ARC's website reflects regarding the lawn care. He commented on the picnic tables, portable toilets and compost pile behind the building. Committeeman DiCicco reiterated that Code Enforcement is looking into the matter.

Rich Walters indicated that the portable toilets are approximately 100 feet from his property and not pleasant to look at.

There being no further public comment, Mayor Murphy asked for a motion adopting the consent agenda, motion was made by O'Connor, seconded by Salimbene, with 5 ayes and no nays, that the consent agenda be adopted.

Committeewoman Salimbene indicated that in regards to Resolution No. 2015-76 – Renewal of the Liquor License, is there an ordinance that establishes hours of operation. Township Solicitor, Jeff April, indicated that there is an extensive ordinance that numerous items.

RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY PROPOSED SEWER PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION THROUGH THE TOWNSHIP OF DENNIS

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Dennis Township Committee that the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority (C.M.C.M.U.A.) is considering replacing the overland hauling of the landfill runoff from the Cape May County Landfill which is located in the Borough of Woodbine and the Township of Upper; and

WHEREAS, the CMCMUA is considering the construction of a sewer pipeline to transport the sewer runoff to a treatment plant in the Township of Middle; and

WHEREAS, the intended alignment of the proposed pipeline passes through the Township of Dennis and provides very little benefit the Township; and

WHEREAS, the intended route through the Township of Dennis is largely rural in nature and the potential exists for future utilization which could change this rural nature; and

WHEREAS, numerous residents of the Township of Dennis have come forth voicing their very real concerns.

Mayor Murphy asked if there were any comments from the public this evening.

There being no comment from those present, motion was made by O'Connor, seconded by Tozer, that the public comment portion be closed.

The Mayor asked for comments from the Committee.

Committeewoman Salimbene gave an update of the Bike Path project with NJ Transit. She thanked Committeeman Tozer for getting Waste Management for picking up trash that had been illegally dumped. Committeewoman Salimbene questioned the Chapter 159 for the Alcohol Education, Rehabilitation and Enforcement Fund and asked if it is earmarked for a particular purpose. The Clerk indicated that it is used to hold special court sessions for DUI cases. The Township Solicitor indicated that the funds come from DUI assessments. She commented on the electric being out in South Dennis due to a pole being struck on Dennisville Road and her concerns with Atlantic City Electric Company's Outage Report on the website. The Township's OEM Coordinator, John Berg, indicated that it wasn't the ACE fault, that the pole belonged to Verizon. Mayor Murphy agreed with Committeewoman Salimbene and indicated that you shouldn't post a time if you don't really know it will be rectified by then and he advised Committeewoman Salimbene that he will give her a telephone number. Committeewoman Salimbene indicated that she finished up the year with the Cultural & Heritage Trivia Contest and the winner was Hannah Shaw Wright who will be attending the July 21st meeting to be recognized. She stated that she is working on a Photo Contest and will report on that at a later date. She reminded everyone that Thursday night there would be a presentation at the Senior Center on drugs, alcohol and the current trends that teenagers could be doing. Ms. Walters questioned who would be giving the presentation and Committeewoman Salimbene indicated that it was John Kriger of Kriger Consultants and that it is sponsored by MAC. She closed her comments by indicating that it is nice to see so many people in attendance.

Committeeman Tozer congratulated the 8th Grade Graduating Class which his younger brother is a member of. He announced that southbound traffic on Route 47 is closed. The Committee commented on an electrical outage. John Berg the Township's OEM Coordinator indicated that it is now open.

Committeeman DiCicco indicated that the Dennis Volunteer Fire Company dedicated a new engine and stated that this is an example of a Fire Company and Fire Commission working together. He announced that they named the engine after Chief Steve Coffee who had passed away this past November. Committeeman DiCicco stated that Chief Coffee was critical member of the Fire Company and that it was very befitting to name the engine after him. He commented on the Fire Company selling the old truck on Gov Deals and the small fire company in Wolf Creek, TN being the only bidder and that their yearly budget is only \$3,000.00 and they could only afford to pay \$6,000.00 for the truck. Dennis Volunteer Fire Company sold it to them for \$6,000.00 plus loaded it with older surplus equipment. He commended the Dennis Volunteer Fire Company for looking out for the greater community. Committeeman DiCicco indicated that the Environmental Commission would be discussing the rumble strips at tomorrow night's meeting. He stated that they were actively looking into this issue, reaching out to the County as well as Senator Van Drew's office. He commented on the negative impact the rumble strips have on the community and as we try to expand the Historic District here, the rumble strips are not good for the historic homes. Members of the audience questioned the meeting. Committeeman DiCicco indicated that everyone is welcome. He continued to discuss the rumble strip issue and the Clerk indicated that the Committee adopted a resolution regarding the rumble strips and have not received any acknowledgement from the NJDOT. He closed with thanking everyone for coming out this evening and indicated that it was great to see everyone.

Deputy Mayor O'Connor echoed Committeeman DiCicco's comments of Dennis Township folks doing good things for the greater community and he commended on being a Champion for "our kids" who are doing the right things and we need to bang that drum loudly. He stated that in today's paper in the sport section that John Mooers who is the youngest of 5 kids all of whom went thru our Recreation Programs, was named the Spring Boy Athlete of the Year. He commented on John's discus records that he set this season and the injury that made him set out the last fall/winter season rehabilitating. He continued to comment on kids who are willing to put the work in to be successful. He commented on Ryan Herlihy being named an All Star and his records as well. Deputy Mayor O'Connor commented on Jenna Herlihy being recognized for her Lacrosse play as well as her sister Summer and he reiterated on the Dennis Township kids doing great. He congratulated the Dennis Township 8th Grade on their Graduation. Deputy Mayor

O'Connor commented on Dennis Township residents Susan Wenner and Jerry Chretien were named Cape May County Special Services teacher of the year. The Clerk indicated that Dennis Township's Teacher of the Year is Committeewoman Salimbene's daughter, Allison Curvan.

Mayor Murphy thanked everyone for coming and asked everyone to be safe out there.

Motion was made by O'Connor, seconded by DiCicco, that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor and the motion carried.
