RESOLUTION OPPOSING COMCAST'S INTERNET DATA USAGE PLAN EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2021

WHEREAS, in Dennis Township and its surrounding areas, citizens have limited options as to where they can obtain services for high-speed internet; and

WHEREAS, Comcast Xfinity Internet Service is currently one of the only options citizens may choose from to provide high-speed internet; and

WHEREAS, on or about January 1, 2021, Comcast introduced their 1.2 Terabyte (TB) Internet Data Usage Plan ("Plan") for Xfinity Internet Service; and

WHEREAS, according to Comcast, said plan provides 1.2 Terabytes of Internet Data usage each month to each customer as part of their monthly Xfinity Internet Service; and

WHEREAS, according to Comcast, if a customer uses more than 1.2 TB in a month, Comcast will automatically add blocks of 50 GB to the customer's account for an additional fee of \$10.00 each 50 GB used; and

WHEREAS, prior to the implementation of the plan, it is upon information and belief that most Comcast customers have unlimited Internet Data usage under their current arrangements with Comcast; and

WHEREAS, it is upon information and belief that upon implementation of the Plan, Comcast is not providing any additional service to the customer, rather they are potentially charging more for the same service they already offered to people who use over the 1.2 TB a month; and

WHEREAS, while the Plan has yet to take effect, the Township Committee of Dennis Township is of the opinion that the implementation of said Internet Data Usage plan will have a negative effect on the citizens of Dennis Township insomuch as citizens of Dennis Township have already been dealing with the ongoing hardships related to the COVID-19 pandemic and are now being potentially subjected to an additional expense by Comcast for something that was purportedly already included in their Comcast packages.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. The statements that are set forth in the Preamble are true and accurate. All of the statements of the Preamble are repeated and incorporated herein by this reference thereto and are made a part hereof as if each and every statement was set forth fully herein.
- 2. The Committee of the Township of Dennis hereby opposes Comcast's implementation of their 1.2 Terabyte Internet Data Usage Plan; and
- 3. Upon adoption of this Resolution the Township Clerk shall forward copies, electronically or otherwise, to the following officials: New Jersey Governor, New Jersey Lieutenant Governor, New Jersey Attorney General, New Jersey Senate and Assembly Majority and Minority Leaders, Cape May County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and the Cape May County Clerk.
