A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE APPROVAL OF A MINING AND EXCAVATION PERMIT RENEWAL FOR BLOCK 225.01, LOT 8.07.

WHEREAS, Kiely Holdings LLC, the Applicant, is the owner of property known as BLOCK 225.01, LOT 8.07 in Dennis Township, New Jersey, on which property it operates a sand mining and excavation operation; and

WHEREAS, Kiely Holdings LLC, holds a mining and exeavation permit for this site; and WHEREAS. Kiely Holdings LLC, now seeks renewal of that permit for a three-year period; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Township Committee Resolution No. 2023-122 and the Township's excavation ordinance, Kiely Holdings LLC's application for that renewal was referred to the Dennis Township Consolidated Land Use Board for a hearing on preliminary and final site plan approval; and recommendation to the Township Committee for renewal of the mining license: and

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Land Use Board has held a public hearing on the application at its regular meeting on October 26, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant, represented by Michael A. Bruno, Esquire, of GIORDANO, HALLERAN & CIESLA, PC, of Red Bank, New Jersey, appeared at that meeting and presented testimony from Steven Filippone, PE, PP, of ENGINEERING DESIGN ASSOCIATES of Ocean View, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant relied upon the Exhibits of the Application; and

WHEREAS, no member of the public spoke in favor or against the application at the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Dennis Township Consolidated Land Use Board having carefully considered the evidence presented by the Applicant, the plans, the application, the exhibits, and the testimony of the witnesses, and having considered as well the comments of its engineer and solicitor, has made and hereby memorializes the following findings of fact and/or conclusions of law:

- 1. Applicant has standing to present this application by virtue of its status as owner of the subject property,
- 2. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this application with the majority vote of the qualified board members required to recommend action on the application.
- 3. The application is deemed complete for purposes of the township land use and resource extraction laws.
- Applicant has given all notices required under law.
- 5. The Board accepts as factual and incorporates the report of its engineer J. Michael Fralinger, PE, CME, dated September 26, 2023, including its findings and recommendations.
- There is currently no activity on site.
- 7. The application complies in all other respects with the Dennis Township land use and excavation ordinances.
- 8. Applicant provided testimony that they will comply with the comments and recommendations set forth in the Technical Review Letter, prepared by Fralinger Engineering PA, dated September 26, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Dennis Township Consolidated Land Use. Board on October 26, 2023, the following:

1. Applicant's request for preliminary and final site plan approval is approved; and, a renewal of the mining and excavation permit, for a period of three years, should be approved by the Township Committee.

The recommendation for approval is subject to the following conditions;

A. The conditions and recommendations contained in the report of the Board's engineer, J. Michael Fralinger, PE, CME, dated September 26, 2023, including but not limited to the Applicant's continued maintenance of the stormwater basin in accordance with the Stoney Court Subdivision Approval, memorialized as Resolution #02-21; and compliance with the bonding requirements set forth in Ordinance § 95-4D, as may be required.

B. Applicant shall continue to comply with all conditions of the previous Resolutions unless specifically addressed in this Resolution; and, maintain the fencing, signage and safety protocols previously establish; and, the present mining areas under excavation shall conform to all Township Standards.

C. Applicant shall receive all other federal, state, and local governmental approvals for the continued operation of the mining and extraction facility.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A MEETING NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq; and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 b and designated below:

- (1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual, unless the individual concerned (or in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease of Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving, the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
- (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege:

 Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.
- (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
- (9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

NOW, THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, assembled in public session on November 14, 2023, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held on November 14, 2023 prior to the close of the above night's meeting in the Dennis Township Municipal Complex, 571 Petersburg Road, Dennisville, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designed above.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP OF DENNIS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE INTRA-COUNTY MUTUAL AID AND ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT WITH PARTICIPATING UNITS IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et. Seq. ("Act") provides that any local governmental unit may enter into a contract with any other local governmental unit to provide or receive any service that each local unit is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, mutual aid and assistance agreements between Cape May County and Municipalities, all of which are political subdivisions and/or municipal corporations of the State of New Jersey, situate in the County of Cape May, individually and on behalf of their departments, including but not limited to law enforcement, Public Works, Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), Medical Reserve Corps (MRC), Construction Officials, Emergency Medical Services ("EMS"), fire departments, volunteer fire companies and/or EMS organizations or Fire Districts. For purposes of this Agreement, a Requesting Entity is a party that requests assistance pursuant to the Agreement. A Providing Entity is a party that provides response assistance or resource support pursuant to the Agreement. Hereinafter referred to as the "Participating Entity", "Requesting Entity" or "Responding Entity"; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, in Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 ("HSPD-5" or the "Presidential Directive"), directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") to develop and administer a National Incident Management System ("NIMS"), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach to Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, then-Acting Governor Richard J. Codey, in his Executive Order No. 50, dated August 5, 2005 (the "Executive Order"), implemented NIMS as the state standard for incident management and directed its use for all emergency incidents in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, "The New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act", N.J.S.A. App. A:9-30 et seq. (the "Disaster Control Act"), provides for the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey during any emergency by centralizing control of all civilian activities having to do with such emergency in the Governor, who shall have authority over the resources of each and every political subdivision of the State to cope with any condition that shall arise out of such emergency; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the Disaster Control Act, the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Act," N.J.S.A. 52:14E-11 et seq. (the "Fire Service Act") establishing a mechanism for the coordination of fire service resources throughout the State to facilitate a quick and efficient response to any emergency incident or situation that requires the immediate deployment of those resources in order to protect life and property from the danger or destruction of fire, explosion or other disaster; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs promulgated rules commonly referred to as the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Regulations" N.J.A.C. 5:75A-1.1 et seq. (the "Fire Service Regulations"), and N.J.A.C. 5:75A-2.2 specifically requires each municipality or fire district to adopt a local fire mutual aid plan; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Township of Dennis deems it to be in the best interest of the Township of Dennis to enter into Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreements with governmental entities throughout Cape May County and all of their departments, authorities, boards, commissions and other functions under the auspice of each participating governmental entity including but not limited to law enforcement, Public Works, Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), Medical Reserve Corps (MRC), Construction Officials, Emergency Medical Services ("EMS"), fire departments, volunteer fire companies and/or EMS organizations or Fire Districts; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Township of Dennis and the Participating Entity recognize the benefits of entering into the Agreement for mutual aid and assistance with each other to protect against loss, damage or destruction by fire, catastrophe or other extraordinary devastation, civil unrest, major emergency, major criminal acts, acts of terrorism, and/or natural and man-made disasters or catastrophes which threaten or affect life, property and environment (the "Emergency Situations") and to address those situations when additional aid and assistance is needed to protect the best interests of the persons and property in each individual jurisdiction.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that the Intra-County Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreements between the Township of Dennis and Participating Units be and the same hereby accepted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and the Municipal Clerk are authorized to execute the Intra-County Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Clerk shall forward a certified copy of this resolution and the accompanying agreement to the County of Cape May Office of Emergency Management.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-09

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DENNIS AMENDING ARTICLE II, CHAPTER 128 OF THE DENNIS TOWNSHIP CODE, LOITERING, GOOD ORDER, AND PEACE

WHEREAS, Township of Dennis, a township form of government, is governed by statutes, specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:63-1, et seq. that allow the Township Committee to pass, adopt, amend and repeal any ordinance or, where permitted, any resolution for any purpose required for the government of the municipality or for the accomplishment of any public purpose for which the municipality is authorized to act under general law;

WHEREAS, Article II, Chapter 128 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Dennis currently outlines the certain types of loitering prohibited within the confines the Township of Dennis;

WHEREAS, the Township Committee believes it desirable, and in the best interest of the Township and its citizens to expand the aforementioned Chapter to address the need for good order in peace within the Township;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Dennis, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Portions of Chapter 128 of the Township of Dennis Municipal Code are amended as follows (additions are <u>underlined</u>; deletions are [bracketed]):

Chapter 128. Loitering, Good Order, and Peace

ARTICLE 1

§ 128-1. Definitions.

As used in this chapter.

LOITERING

Remaining idle or walking aimlessly about in essentially one location.

PARENT or GUARDIAN

Any adult person having care or custody of a minor, whether by reason of blood relationship, the order of any court or otherwise.

PUBLIC PLACE

A place to which the public has access and shall include any public building and grounds, street, boardwalk or sidewalk. It shall also include the front or neighborhood of a store, shop, restaurant, tavern or other place of business, and public grounds, areas, parks and marinas, as well as parking lots or other vacant private property not owned by or under the control of the person charged with violating this section or in the case of a minor, not owned or under the control of his parent or guardian.

QUASI-PUBLIC PLACE

Private or publicly owned property utilized for proprietary or business uses which invites patronage by the public or which invites public ingress and egress.

§ 128-2. Certain Types of Loitering Prohibited.

No person shall loiter in a public or quasi-public place in such a manner as to:

- A. Obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles.
- B. Obstruct, molest or interfere with any person lawfully in a public <u>or quasi-public</u> place. This section shall include the making of unsolicited remarks of an offensive, disgusting or insulting nature or which are calculated to annoy or disturb the person to, or in whose hearing, they are made.

§ 128-3. Violation.

Any person violating the provisions of this chapter shall be ordered to move on by a police officer, constable or other law enforcement officer and failing which shall be guilty of a violation of this chapter.

§ 128-4. Loitering by minors; notice; presumption.

The parent or guardian of a minor under the age of 18 years shall knowingly permit that minor to loiter in violation of this chapter. Whenever any minor under the age of 18 years is charged with a violation of this chapter, his parent or guardian shall be notified of this fact. If at any time within 30 days following the giving of notice, the minor to whom such notice relates again violates this chapter, it shall be presumed in the absence of evidence to the contrary that the minor did so with the knowledge and permission of his parent or guardian.

§ 128-5. Penalty.

Any person violating the terms or provisions of this <u>Article I of Chapter 128</u> for a first offense shall be liable for a fine of up to \$500, incarceration in the Cape May County Jail for a period not to exceed 30 days and ordered to perform community service for a period of time not to exceed 100 hours.

§ 128-6. Observance of lawful orders and posted traffic regulations.

No person shall disobey or fail to follow the order, direction or other signal of any police officer, sheriff's deputy, New Jersey State Trooper, constable or other properly authorized law enforcement official within the Township; nor shall any persons disobey or fail to follow the traffic instructions on any properly posted traffic control device or traffic signal within the Township.

ARTICLE II - GOOD ORDER AND PEACE

§ 128-7. Obstruction.

- A. No person shall intentionally obstruct pedestrian or vehicular traffic upon the public streets, public sidewalks, public pavilions, public parks or other public places. Acts authorized as an exercise of one's Constitutional right to picket or legally protest and acts authorized by a permit issued pursuant to the Code of the Township of Dennis shall not constitute obstruction of pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
- B. No person shall sleep in or on any public or quasi-public street, sidewalk, pavilion, park or other place so as to obstruct or interfere with the passage of any person or persons lawfully being on or upon said streets, sidewalks, pavilions, parks or places.
- C. It shall be unlawful to sleep in any parked vehicle, either day or night, within the Township limits or to sleep or lie upon any public or quasi-public bench or seat or to usurp the use of such bench or seat for the storage of bundles or other objects so as to prevent the reasonable use thereof by others.
- D. No person shall loiter on governmentally owned property within the confines of the Township of Dennis between the hours of between the hours of 10:00 p.m. to sunrise except for unusual and unforeseen emergencies, township sponsored activities, and/or otherwise approved by Township Committee.

§ 128-8. Illegal entry.

It shall be unlawful and illegal to enter, without legitimate and reasonable errand or business, upon any private property, hotel, rooming house, lodging place or other place of public accommodation, and not having previously obtained express or implied permission of the owner or person in lawful control and possession of such places above described, to make use of the furniture, showers, toilets or other like facilities there installed, or wander or roam about the premises.

§ 128-9. Disturbing good order and peace.

A. <u>It shall be unlawful and offensive conduct for any individual, either alone, or in the company of others, to revel, quarrel, brawl, disport or behave in a</u>

noisy, boisterous manner, emitting loud cries and other noises, or jostling those about them, or causing inconveniences to those about them, or to otherwise disrupt and disturb the public peace and dignity, in any public or quasi-public place, public rights-of-way, public sidewalk, public park, or in any building open for the accommodation of the public for entertainment, or for room accommodations.

B. It shall be unlawful and offensive to enter upon any public or quasi-public place or private property without the consent of the owner or person in lawful control and possession thereof and to there picnic, change apparel, dress or undress or to urinate or defecate upon the premises or commit any other nuisance.

§ 128-10. Violations and penalties.

Any person of association or persons convicted of a violation of any provision of this **Article II of Chapter 128** shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not exceeding \$2,000 or 90 days imprisonment in the City or county jail, or for a period of community service not exceeding 90 days, or any combination of the three.

- **Section 2.** All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.
- Section 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.
- **Section 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect within twenty (20) days of final passage and publication, as provided by law.
